- A free software office suite
- A fork of OpenOffice.org (OOo)
- Developed by The Document Foundation on 28th Sept 2010
- Available on Linux, Windows and Mac OS X
- Compatible with other major office suite

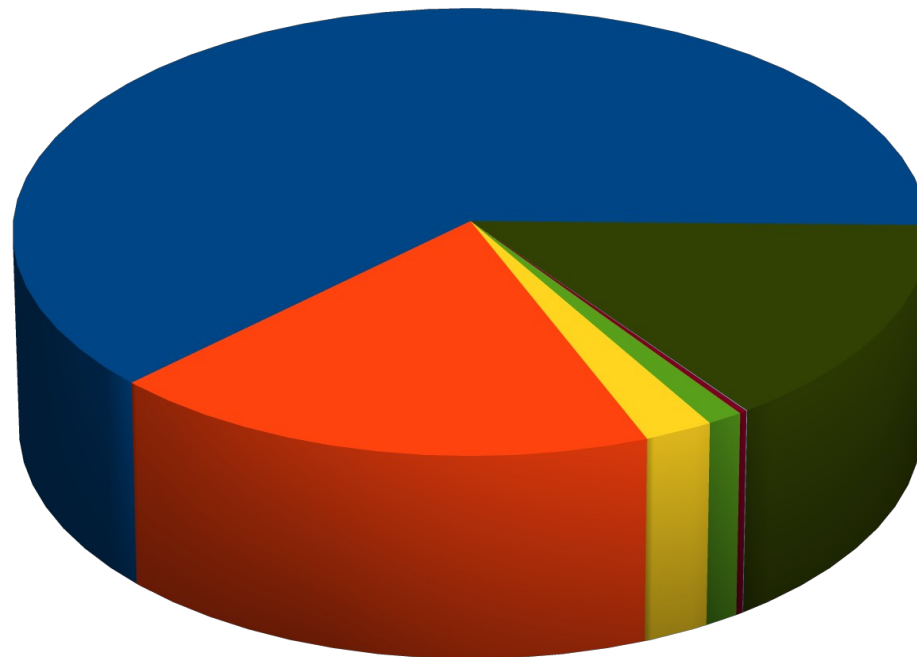
